What is Canine Care Certified?

Dogs deserve the highest standards of care and quality of life we can offer them. Breeders demonstrate ethics in action when they voluntarily choose to go above and beyond what the law requires in caring for their dogs. Purdue University's Canine Care Certified program is a nationwide, voluntary initiative that sets standards of care for dogs that far exceed those required by law, and helps breeders to meet public demands for healthy, happy dogs and puppies. To be certified, kennels are audited by a highly reputable independent certification company with a long history of expertise in animal welfare and on-premises auditing.

The Canine Care Certified Standards of Care were developed by internationally recognized animal science and veterinary medicine leaders with expertise in canine health, behavior, nutrition, genetics and ethics. They are rooted in existing and ongoing scientific research. Certified kennels must follow the Standards of Care for parents and pups as summarized under the five pillars of care.
